Marie-Claude Boudreau

Marie-Claude Boudreau has been a facilitator since 2004 and has worked at the federal government for 6 years. She dedicated the past five years to applied ethics in the province of Québec but has also been active as a contractual facilitator for the federal government.

She is currently completing a master's degree in applied ethics at the Université de Sherbrooke, which is funded in part by a SSHRC grant. Through her master's research at the Université de Sherbrooke, Marie-Claude Boudreau is looking at ways to better integrate ethics in the world of work. More than simply creating ethical codes, she wants to develop formal and integrated tools to help organizations further their efforts to promote ethical behaviour in the workplace. She is a member of the Community of Practices for Ethics Practitioners and a lecturer in applied ethics at the same university.

For the past two years, she has been a facilitator for the *Chaire d'éthique appliquée*, delivering customized 35 hour courses on ethical dialogue and decision-making to employees and managers of Québec provincial government.

She holds an honours bachelor's degree in international commerce at the University of Ottawa, finishing *Magna cum laude*. She was recipient of many scholarships including the "Ethics in the new millennium" scholarship.

Previously, she has worked with different organizations, mainly within the federal government (Elections Canada, Canada Space Agency, Citizenship and Immigration Canada, Société des alcools du Québec) in facilitating values and ethics sessions as well as ethical decision-making training for managers and employees. Furthermore, she has over 5 years of experience facilitating in academic and community institutions.

Marie-Claude has worked with Professor Yves Boisvert, at *Ecole nationale d'administration publique*, where she was a research assistant, working on building a database of existing tools in the field of organizational ethics.

Marie-Claude's community services include volunteering as a nursing guide and support for new mothers and their infant, as well as six years working with physically and mentally handicapped young adults, helping them develop social independence. She has also worked for two years as a French language monitor in a public school board, promoting French culture in a multiethnic community.
