As the Officer in Charge of Staffing and Personnel for the Province of Saskatchewan, Earl was called upon on a daily basis to make decisions and to resolve conflicts in numerous situations relating to human resource planning, succession management and other sensitive issues that affect the careers of Members of the RCMP. This diversity of experience in criminal investigations and policing administration has been further augmented by his experience in the private sector, not only with the Vancouver Stock Exchange and KPMG, but also as the Integrity Commissioner for the cities of Hamilton and Windsor.

As the Mayor for the District of Sechelt, BC, Earl managed budgets totaling in excess of \$28 million for the District of Sechelt as well as the Sunshine Coast Regional District. He also demonstrated excellent communication skills and strong leadership to this community. Sechelt is a diverse community. Residents of the District include a strong retirement community along with personnel in the logging industry, the fishing industry, the tourist industry and the environmental protection industry. Earl was instrumental in obtaining consensus for the Strategic Community Plan, notwithstanding that the objectives of each diverse group often clashed.

This is demonstrated by his dealings with the Sechelt Indian Band. The Sechelt Indian Band Reserve was enclosed within the District of Sechelt and decisions often affected each community. Thus, it was important to cooperate with the Band and their Council to ensure a harmonious atmosphere within the two communities and between the two governments. Earl consulted with the Chief of the Sechelt Indian Band and obtained approval for the Band to hold a "smudging" ceremony at the inaugural Council Meeting of the District of Sechelt Council to cleanse the Chambers for the new Council. The Sechelt Indian Band and the District of Sechelt had no major conflicts during his term as the Mayor. Any conflicts that did arise were resolved through mediation and consultation with the Chief and the Band Council.
